ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

Carl Lounsbury retired in 2016 as the Senior Architectural Historian at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. Over his 35-year career at CW, Carl researched English and colonial American public buildings, churches, meetinghouses, and theatres as well as the terminology, practice, and technology of preindustrial building. He assisted in the restoration of the courthouse, market house and other buildings in Williamsburg's Historic Area and has taught courses in architectural history at William and Mary, UVA, VCU and Mary Washington. Carl earned his undergraduate degrees in History and English from UNC Chapel Hill and his MA and PhD in American Studies from Geroge Washington University. His publications include An Illustrated Glossary of Early Southern Architecture and Landscape (1994), From Statehouse to Courthouse: An Architectural History of South Carolina's Colonial Capitol and the Charleston County Courthouse (2001), and The Courthouses of Early Virginia (2005). He served as a co-author and contributor to The Chesapeake House: Architectural Investigation by Colonial Williamsburg (2013) and was a member of the Foundation for Historic Christ Church's Board of Directors from 2010-2016.

Kenneth Tappan graduated from Christopher Newport University in 2009 with a degree in History and started working with the Masonry Trades at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation in 2010. At Colonial Williamsburg he has been part of many reconstructions and preservation efforts within Williamsburg's Historic Area. Outside of Colonial Williamsburg he has led preservation efforts on various 17th and 18th century structures. He has also worked in brickmaking in England and researched historic color washes and building limes.
